INTRODUCTION

This is exemplified by the activities that took place in the month of July. The school continued to put one block on top of another in its effort of providing the church with highly skilled and comptent manpower. Both teachers, students, the board and various converge in this endevour. The view is to produce a well trained soldier for Christ through various activities. The following are some of the few things that we can report on.

1.0 CURRICULUM PROGRESS

The 2022 -2024 intake covered a lot of ground its first term of learning at BVBIZ. The following subjects were done and completed successfully; Godhead, Life of Christ, Public Speaking, How We Got the Bible, Personal Work I, New Testament Church, Scheme of Redemption, English Writing Skills and Horticulture I & II.

2.0 PROJECTS

BVBIZ continue to lay the foundation in its drive towards some viable projects. Broilers have been doing well though less were raised during the winter season. The goat project is also doing well. The goats now stand at 17. The tuckshop project though very small has faced challenges of price fluctuations and a proper room to run the project. Once the issue of a room is dealt with, the project is promising. Besides these, we can single out the following;

2.1 LAYERS

The planned layers project reached another level in the month of July. More people came joined others to support the vision. From the month of May, the following contributions have come in;

Construction of the fowl run will commence in August. Great appreciation to those who have contributed so far. The target was 300 layers. By the last day of July, a third of the target had been reached. Construction of the fowl run is expected to commence towards the end of August. Booking of the point of Lay birds will be done towards the same time. Those who still wanted to partner the school in this effort are still welcome.

2.2 HORTICULTURE

The school's horticulture project which had started at a low pace accelerated towards the end of the month. The first crop to be sold is lettuce. Sales are expected to rise as in the next few months. Capacitating the project has been a challenge but God answers prayers in many ways. For some time the school had been wishing to advance its horticulture program. The focus of this development has always been to advance life survival skills in students and also provide some income to the school. God answered the prayer through Healing Hands International. In early July, BVBIZ received \$2500 towards fencing its garden and installation of a drip system. Close to a hectare was eventually fenced and a drip system installed. The school is very grateful to HHI for this gesture.

Soon after the fencing and installation of the drip system, students planted 3000 tomatoes seedlings, 500 lettuces, cucumbers, butternuts and other vegetables with maize going to be planted in early August. The following pictures tell the story;







3.0 UPCOMING PROGRAMS

3.1 GRADUATION AND PREACHER'S RETREAT

This year's graduation shall take place on the 29th of October. This ceremony will be preceded by a 2 day preachers retreat (26-28 October). On the 28th, there shall be a graduation lecture code named the Isaiah Suwari memorial lecture.

3.2 GRADUATION AWARDS

The BVBIZ board is initiating a fundraising event geared towards the construction of a classroom block at the school. The event shall take place on the 1st of October at Blackstone primary school in Harare. Proper classrooms are a missing piece at the BVBIZ campus. Meal tickets ranging from \$10 to \$150 will be sold in advance. Stakeholders shall be notified of the individuals who will be in possession of the tickets. In total, \$35000 is needed to complete the structure. Whatever is raised will be put to use whilst further fundraising campaigns will continue till the structure is completed. Lot 64 Church of Christ July Report By M & R Mhlanga

INTRODUCTION.

The first part of our final field practicum running from 15 June to 15 August started well though on a slow start. We managed to perform some of the required duties without any disturbances. The only challenge we faced is that the area is a very small area and has previously worked on causing many residents not welcoming us as they say they already met some of our fellow workers. However, the community reaction did not deter our evangelistic spirit, God is enabling us to complete our field. We are therefore glad to present our report as below.

2.0 Evangelism

Our evangelistic efforts were very successful though despite some little resistance from SDA members in the area. In our evangelism effort we used several methods such as door to door, devotional services, Devotional lessons, Cell groups every week on Thursdays to fully bring people to the knowledge of the only true God to the people. However, we are looking forward to receive some WBS books and tracts to help us in our evangelistic drive.

2.1 Devotions

Home devotions form the core of this field practicum. We visited homes and conduct door to door devotions in Lot 64 homesteads. In the process both church members and non-member were strengthened in the faith. During our devotions we share the word of God as we heed from the book of James 4:8 which call people to draw near to Him so that He can draw near to that. We also manage to pray for the sick and God healed them. In total we had 44 devotions to mark the end of July.

2.3 Prospects

As we evangelise and do Devotions we managed to come up with 51 prospects. These included the household family members. Few prospects were responsive, they promise to attend the services. Thulani Ndlara and Terence Livhi indicated the need for baptisms but were detered by the cold weather. Those belonging to SDA did not welcome us citing that they were busy. All the prospects were from Lot 64.

2.4 Restorations and New Convert.

We managed to restore to the faith 2 people Mai Keyla and Luckmore Ndlara who had backslided. Only Thulani Ndlara accepted Jesus as Lord and Saviour but is yet to be baptized.

2.5 WBS, Tracts and Pamphlets

A couple of tracts and few WBS courses were distributed. A total of 161 tracts were distributed . New Testament Worship 12, The Gospel of Christ 27, Kereke YeMubhaibheri 29, Covenants 11, Church of the Bible 5, Bible Covenants and The Lord's Supper 30 as well as The Voice of Truth 11 and Tracts course distributed yet. 48 Pamphlets were distributed and 5 Introductory WBS courses were distributed.

2.6 Baptisms

No baptism was conducted. Those who promised to be baptised could not do so citing weather as excuse and these are Terence Livhi of Lot 64 at John Farm and friend as well as Thulani

2.7 Midweek Services.

The Church successfully conducted 4 midweek services. The attendance was poor averaging 7 Adults and 4 children's per service. Despite the low attendance the members were lively and the services proceeded well. Remember Mhlanga preached on all the midweek services. Regarding the absentees, immediate

action was taken on some members as the Preacher visited some members to check why they were not attending and encouraged them to attend the next service.

2.8 Sunday Services.

As a team managed to have 5 Sunday service which had average attendance of 15 people per service. The poor attendance was a customary thing: members had week in and week out syndrome. Total Sunday giving amounted to US\$\$2 and ZW\$950.

2.9 Benevolence Day.

Benevolence day happens to be one of the most soul touching evangelism effort we had .The whole Church conducted a benevolence Sunday at Gogo Nyathi where the word of God was shared. Afterward women helped with house chores such as sweeping and cleaning the yard, fetching water etc whilst men went to fetch firewood to bring warmth to the old women.

2.9 Preaching and song leading opportunities

The preacher managed to have 5 preaching and 4 leading opportunities on Sundays.

3.0 Welfare.

We are grateful to Lot 64 for taking good care of us during our stay at Lot 64. Unfortunately, we could not account for this but we cherish their support.
